
Sunday's Message

What Types of Health Screening Do Mature Adults Need?

Most insurances including Medicare and Medicaid offer screenings on their plans. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services uses these offerings to determine if they are following quality of care measures and keeping you healthy.

Health Screening -continued-

Check out your plans to see if they offer these:

An Annual Wellness Visit: This plan is designed for you and your health care provider to keep you healthy or address any issues you may be having with your health, including mental health.

Flu and Pneumonic Vaccines: These are recommended yearly for all ages and prevent flu and pneumonia illness and deaths especially in vulnerable populations such as young children, those with chronic diseases and the elderly.

Diabetes Screening: These screenings include family history, body weight, and blood sugar levels. You may be able to have two screenings a year if you are at risk such as diagnosed with pre-diabetes.

Obesity screening and counseling: This falls in line with diabetes screening. If you have a body mass index of 30 or more, you are more likely to develop illness such as heart disease and diabetes. The counseling programs use healthy lifestyles changes such as diet, proper food choices, and exercise.

Breast Cancer Screening: Women age 40 and older are eligible for screening mammograms and breast exams to detect breast cancer.

Prostate Cancer Screening: Men over the age of 50 are covered for an annual digital rectal exam or PSA testing to detect prostate cancer.

Glaucoma Screening: Glaucoma can lead to vision loss if left untreated. This is offered if you have a family history of diabetes.

Colorectal Cancer Screening: Check your plan to see how often a colonoscopy is offered. Many plans cover a fecal occult (hidden blood in your stool) test that is easy and effective in screening for colorectal cancer.

Bone Density Screening: A DEXA scan can measure your risk of fractured bones or osteoporosis and usually is covered every 24 months, or more if medically necessary.

Pap and Pelvis Exams: Regular pap test and pelvis exams can detect cervical and vaginal cancers early.
