Community United Methodist Church is pleased to be offering "Response to Sexual Violence Awareness Training" for High School Juniors and Seniors, especially for those going off to College. Adults are welcomed to attend this training. Classes will be offered at Community United Methodist Church, 120 N Pickaway St., Circleville, Ohio. Enter Door "C". **Saturday July 31, or August 7, 2021 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. with a lunch break from 12 to 1.**

Prepare your children for worst case scenarios that can and do happen while far away from home at colleges throughout the U.S. and the World. Should you or your high school juniors and seniors be interested in attending this training please contact Community United Methodist Church 740-474-4796 or Rick Seeds 740-474-2623, Home or 740-497-3695 Cell. Pre-Registration required due to limited seating.

Subject areas to be covered but not limited to;

Physical/Mental Limitations, Intuition, Understanding the Sex Offender/Methods of Attack, What to Expect as a New College Student, Location Change, Fight or Flight, Fight/Submit/Escape, Safety Strategies, Stance, Movement, Escape and Evasion Techniques, Balance Displacement, Hand, Knee and Elbow Strikes, Getting to the Ground Safely/Getting Up Safely, Ground Defenses - How to Fight off an Attacker, How to Escape When Pinned to Ground and much more.

Wear comfortable clothes, sweats, gym/training clothes etc. Please wear or bring clean socks, no bare feet nor street shoes will be allowed on the mats.

Classes will be taught by Rick Seeds and offered at **NO COST** to you. Rick has been involved in Self-Defense and Martial Arts training for over 30 years and holds Black Belts in Tokoshikan Aikijitsu and Shingitai Goshin-Jitsu. He also taught Self-Defense for the State of Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction for over 20 years.
