

Luke 13:18-21

God takes tiny things and grows them into gigantic things.

Spiritual growth is when God takes small acts of faith, prayerful moments, quiet times of questioning and snippets of praise and cultivates them into something completely different.

Sometimes our growth is like the mustard seed, predictable, and welcoming- sometimes it is like the yeast, unknown and hidden and out of control.

Mustard seed grew a large tree that produced a fruit and branches for the birds to nest in.

Yeast was "hidden" within the small leftover pieces of bread from the day before.

The yeast bread would feed 100 people.

Allow God to care and nurture the spiritual growth in your life, be open and see what happens.

Action Steps:

- 1. Support the Youth Mission Trip.
- 2. Remember the Congregation Care Center
- 3. Hold onto your Mustard Seed as a promise of God.
